The Rush team will be meeting with decorators and alumni May 2 to discuss ideas. Of course, everyone is excited to get a new pledge


"I'm excited for it to all come together and how all of our hard work will pay off," Witte said.

It's no secret that a long overdue makeover is happening at the Kappa house. Construction starts May 11, 2019 and will open back up in August 2020. Since the house will not be ready in time, the current freshman pledge class will be living all together in Cross next year. In light of this, the



president decided to appoint two freshmen house chair representatives to be a liaison to the house chair and a voice for the freshman class. Grace Schrimsher and Alyse Jones were recommended for these positions. Schrimsher accepted the position because

Over the past months, Kappa has been fundraising to help pay for the renovations. We have received donations from alumni, parents of current members and others. Old furniture and décor will be sold with the money going toward the renovation as well. Items in the house that are being kept will be either put in Kappa Hall or storage. Current chapter members will not have additional charges on semester dues to help cover the house. However, the rising sophomores living in Cross will have to pay \$3,000 more than they would if they lived in Kappa. To help with the communication between Cross and the parents, the house board held a meeting on Mom's weekend with the freshman class and their moms. There were Cross representatives and house board members. The meeting was very informative, giving information on costs and other amenities with a question session at the end.

"It's sad because we won't get the experience that everyone has had in the years before us but exciting because the pledge classes to come are going to have such a beautiful house," Jones said.

While the freshmen don't get to have the experience of living in the house, it feels rewarding knowing that they are a part of something to better the sorority and keep Kappa on top.
